

UK WEEE Compliance

Collection and Recycling Arrangements in the United Kingdom

Under the UK Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) Regulations, Oncam are required to provide arrangements for the collection, treatment, recycling and recovery of any electrical and electronic equipment that you buy from Oncam for when equipment eventually becomes waste. This is referred to as New WEEE.

Oncam absorb the environmental costs in relation to WEEE and we believe in being transparent with you on any new environmental costs that our products need to address. Our approach to environmental costs is:

- Oncam pays for the costs of treatment, recycling and recovery of the WEEE to meet the targets set by the WEEE Regulations;
- Oncam pays for the costs of data management and reporting to the Environment Agency to demonstrate compliance with all administrative requirements of the WEEE Regulations;
- Our customers and or Oncam pay for transportation of their WEEE to Oncam who will use an authorised recycler in the UK.

All WEEE that arises from the purchase of Oncam products is classed as non-hazardous waste and does not contain Persistent Organic Pollutants (POPs) to class it as hazardous WEEE. As the waste holder, it is your responsibility to confirm that the waste Oncam equipment has not become hazardous during the product use. For example, if the equipment has become contaminated during use, please follow a recommended decontamination procedure.

It may be yours or Oncam's responsibility to arrange and pay for costs of collection and transportation to the recycler, in this case Oncam. To request collection and transport of WEEE, please [contact us](#).

Oncam fulfil our obligations under WEEE through an authorised producer compliance scheme, who are authorised to undertake this duty by the Environment Agency (EA) through provision 19. *Declaration of Compliance* of the WEEE Regulations.
